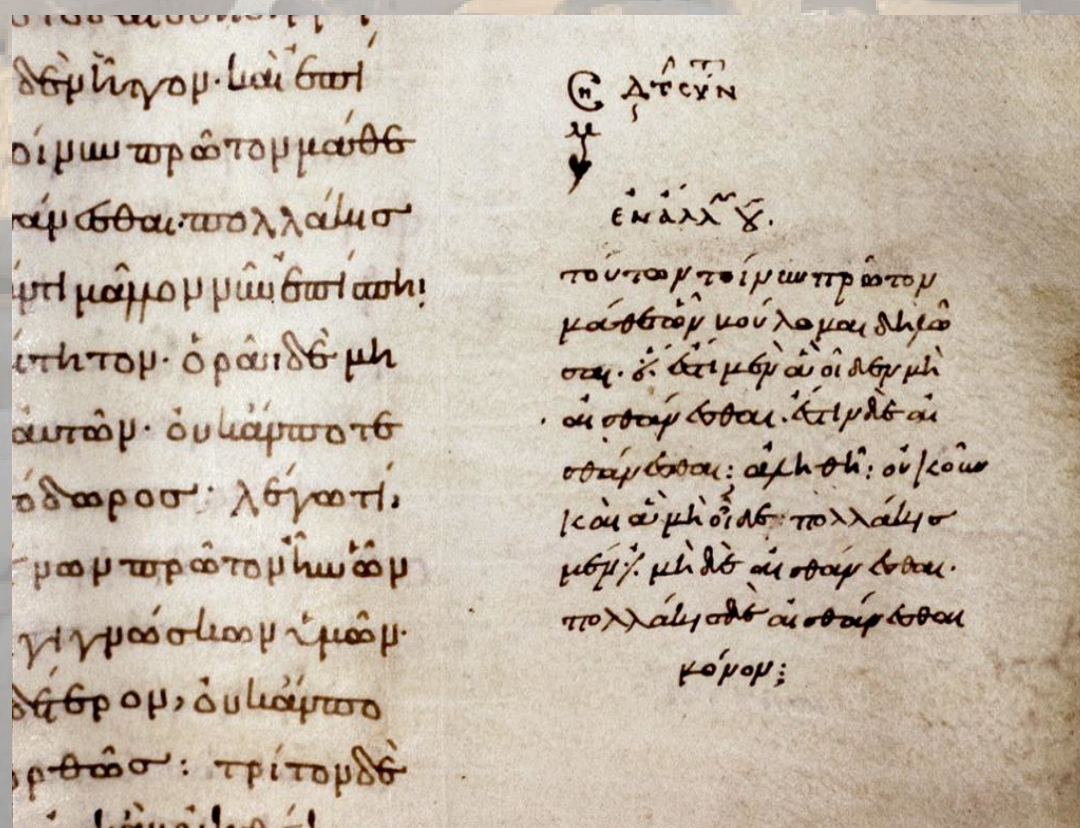
“Missing and Unfinished Platonic Dialogues”

Mary Louise Gill joined the Brown Philosophy and Classics Departments in 2001 after teaching at the University of Pittsburgh. She has held visiting appointments at Dartmouth, Stanford, UCLA, UC-Davis, and Harvard. She has been a fellow at the Stanford Humanities Center, a visiting fellow at Clare Hall, Cambridge, a member of the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, and a fellow at the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard. Gill’s research interests center on ancient Greek philosophy, ancient science, and early modern philosophy. She is the author/co-editor of five books in Ancient Philosophy, with two more forthcoming. She is currently working on Plato’s later epistemology and on Aristotle’s metaphysics and natural philosophy.
