Program

The Women's Studies Program requires 30 credits for the **major**. The five core courses that need to be completed are WMS 150–Introduction to Women's Studies, WMS 300–Field Experience in Women's Studies, 315–Introduction to Feminist Theories and Methodologies and WMS 400–Critical Issues and Feminist Scholarship and WMS 310–Race, Class and Sexuality OR WMS 320–Feminist Thought Into Action. The additional 15 credits may be selected from other WMS courses and over 55 other approved courses offered through 13 departments in 4 colleges. The Women's Studies **minor** requires 18 credits, including both WMS 150 and WMS 315 and four additional courses from the approved list.

The following information applies to the Kingston Campus: Several sections of WMS 150 are taught each semester. WMS 315 is taught in the fall and spring semester and should be taken in the freshmen or sophomore year. WMS 300 is usually taught in the fall and spring semesters and can be taken any year for 2-6 credits. WMS 310 is taught in the fall semester and can be taken after WMS 150 or 315 is completed. WMS 320 is taught in the spring semester and can be taken after WMS 150. WMS 400, the capstone course, is taught in the spring semester, preferably in the senior year; WMS 310 and WMS 315 are prerequisites
