URI Hopes for the Largest Number of Contestants at the A-10 Shootout

Kingston- The A-10 Shootout has become a staple in the University of Rhode Island Intramural Sports Program. Every year students can take a shot at winning a variety of prizes by simply being the best at shooting a basketball with a teammate. URI has provided the second largest school representation in the past four years in this event. This year, URI plans to reach a record setting number of participants by providing bigger and better prizes through this program that is administered through the Atlantic 10 Conference.

"Last year we had over 400 students who participated in the shootout," Peter Koutroumpis, Coordinator of Intramural Sports said. "We would like to increase that number by 25-30%, but we will need the support of the student body in order to reach our goal."

The event will take place on Thursday, February 23 at 6 p.m. in Mackal Field House, and there will be free food, t-shirts and a gift bag for all the participants. All students are wel-
