Energy Fellows Program



Offered by the URI Energy Center, the Energy Fellows Program gives URI undergraduate students the opportunity to gain hands on experience solving real world energy problems.

Eligibility:

Any full-time undergraduate student enrolled at the University is eligible to apply. Students will be chosen for their ability to conduct challenging research, work independently, communicate well with others, and exhibit a sustained interest in one of the following focus areas:

- Energy resources research & development
- Energy efficiency & technology assessment
- Economic analysis & energy policy
- Extension and outreach

Expectations:

Selected students will begin work in January of 2009 continuing through the fall of 2009. Fellows will work in vertically integrated teams with a graduate student and faculty advisor to conduct a 12 month research, policy or outreach project focused within one of the aforementioned areas of interest. At the conclusion of the internship, fellows will present their research findings to the University community and general public at the annual RI Energy Solutions Expo.

Benefits:

To attract a diverse applicant pool of the most capable and mature students the following benefits will be offered:

- The opportunity to earn a summer stipend.
- The opportunity to earn internship or research credits.
- Specialized training in leadership, communication, & professional development.
