Faculty Senate Curricular Affairs Committee Four Hundred Forty-Sixth Report

At the November 20, 2006 meeting of the Curricular Affairs Committee the following matters were considered and are now presented to the Faculty Senate.

SECTION I

Informational Matters

A. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Department of Modern and Classical Languages

CHANGE: Description and prerequisite for the following courses:

- a. **FRN 320 Studies in French Cinema (3)**
Study of major French/Francophone film genres and of prominent French/Francophone directors. Emphasis will vary. Course taught in English. Students counting the course for a major or minor in French are required to do all written work in French and must have credit for FRN 204 and 207. May be repeated with different topics for a maximum of 9 credits.
- b. **ITL 315 Italian Cinema (3)**
Representative Italian films and their directors through viewing and discussions of films, lectures and readings. Course taught in English. Students counting the course for a major or minor in Italian are required to do written work in Italian and must have credit for ITL 205 or 206 or permission instructor. May be repeated with different topics for a maximum of 9 credits.

2. Department of Political Science

CHANGE: Description and prerequisite for PSC 342:

PSC 342 Political Theory: Modern and Contemporary (3)
Continuation of 341. Rousseau to the present." (Lec 3) Pre:
113 and 116.

B. College of the Environment and Life Sciences

Department of Natural Resources Science

CHANGE: Description of the Environmental Science and Management
Major by replacing "and economics, planning, policy and law"
with "and land use management."

Curricular Matters Which Require Confirmation by the Faculty Senate

A. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Department of Sociology and Anthropology

- * a. CHANGE: Title of B.S. in Applied Sociology to "B.S. in Sociology."
- b. CHANGE: Admission requirements to the Criminology and Criminal Justice Option to read as follows:

Admission to this option is selective. Applications will be reviewed only once each year, usually on or about March 1. Students must apply by the end of February by submitting their names to the University College advisor for Sociology or to the Chairperson of the Department of Sociology and Anthropology. To be considered for the Criminology and Criminal Justice Option, students must have earned a minimum of 45 credits, including SOC 100, SOC 230 and PSC/SOC 274 by the application deadline. Preference for admission will be given to those individuals with the highest overall grade averages.

2. Women's Studies Program and Department of English

ADD: WMS 317 (or ENG 317) Contemporary Women Novelists of the Americas (3)

Novels by contemporary women writers from the American continent. Topics include construction of the female body, sexuality and desire, motherhood, exile and immigration, women and work. (Lec. 3)

B. College of the Environment and Life Sciences

1. Department of Biological Sciences

- a. CHANGE: Major requirements for the B.A. in Biology and B.S. in Biological Sciences by permitting students to choose either MIC 201 or MIC 211 to satisfy the current MIC 211 requirement.
- b. CORRECTION: BIO 321 Plant Diversity (3) was not deleted and should not have been on the list of deletions in the 444 Report of the CAC.
- c. DELETE: BIO 331 Parasitology (3)

2. Department of Environmental and Natural Resources Economics

CHANGE: Course code for all REN courses to EEC (Environmental Economics) effective Fall 2007.

Department of Physics

ADD: PHY 430X Modern Biological Physics (3)

Biological function of cell, tissue, and organism in terms of structure and behavior of biological molecules. Review modern biological physics problems. Develop physical understanding of biomolecular structure, organization, and function. (Lec. 3) Pre: permission of instructor.

2. College of Human Science and Services

Department of Human Development and Family Studies

CHANGE: Prerequisite for the following courses:

- a) HDF 400 to "Pre: 200 or PSY 232 and HDF 201."
- b) HDF 432 to "Pre: 200 or PSY 232."

3. College of the Environment and Life Sciences

Department of Biological Sciences, Cell and Molecular Biology and Plant Sciences

CHANGE: Course code for BCH 452 (or PLS 452) to "BCH 452 (or BIO 452)."

B. Curricular Matters Which Require Confirmation by the Faculty Senate

1. College of Arts and Sciences

Department of Modern Classical Languages

1) Add: The following courses:

- a) **SPA 471 Topics in Latin American Literature and Culture**
Latin American topics or author not emphasized in other courses. (Seminar) Pre: 325 or permission of instructor. May be repeated with a change in topic for a maximum of 6 credits.
- b) **SPA 472 Topics in Hispanic Literature**
Topics in Hispanic linguistics not emphasized in other courses. (Seminar) Pre: 325 or permission of instructor. May be repeated with a change in topic for a maximum of 6 credits.
- c) **SPA 473, Topics in Spanish Literature and Culture**
Spanish topics or authors not emphasized in other courses. (Seminar) Pre: 325 or permission of instructor. May be repeated with a change in topic for a maximum of 6 credits.

2) DELETE: **SPA 470 Topics in Hispanic Literature (3)**

* 2. College of Pharmacy – Pharm.D. Program

Department of Pharmacy Practice

1) CHANGE: Title and description for PHP 440:

PHP 440 Advanced Pediatric Pharmacotherapy (3)
Pharmacotherapeutic needs of infants, children, and adolescents with a focus on pharmacokinetic, pharmacodynamic, and other developmental-associated physiological changes. (Lec. 3) Pre: fourth-year standing (second professional year) in the Doctor of Pharmacy program.

2) DELETE: The following Pharm.D. courses:

- b) PHP 590 Advanced Clinical Pharmacy Clerkship (3)
