Faculty Senate Curricular Affairs Committee Four Hundred Fifty-Fourth Report

At the October 29, 2007 meeting of the Curricular Affairs Committee the following matters were considered and are now presented to the Faculty Senate.

SECTION I

Informational Matters

A. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Department of Art and Art History

CHANGE: Title and description for the following courses:

- 1) **ART 213 Photography I - B/W Photography (3)**
Introduction to basic black and white photography and exploration of relate techniques using light-sensitive materials. Emphasis on photography as an artistic media. Required projects and readings.
- 2) **ART 314 Photography II - B/W Darkroom (3)**
Continuation of 213 with emphasis on expanding skills in creative photographic expression, technique and communication. Discussions/papers on contemporary photography. May be repeated once for credit with permission of instructor.

2. Departments of Communication Studies and Journalism

CHANGE: Pre-major mathematics and quantitative requirement for the Public Relations major to "any general education course that meets the College of Arts and Sciences Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning requirement."

3. College Writing Program

CHANGE: Prerequisite for WRT 353 to "Pre: Permission of instructor or B or better in 2 WRT courses."

B. College of the Environment and Life Sciences

Departments of Biological Science and Geosciences

CHANGE: Number for BIO 250 (or GEO 250) to "BIO 272 (or GEO 272) Evolution."

C. College of Human Science and Services

Department of Human Development and Family Studies

CHANGE: Prerequisite for HDF 202 to "Pre: admission to HDF or BGS Program."

D. Online Courses

Curricular Matters Which Require Confirmation by the Faculty Senate.

A. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Department of Art

a. CHANGE: Level, number, description and prerequisite for ART 285 effective spring 2008:

ARH 385 (285) Women in Art
 Examination of women artists and their work in the history of western art; analysis of representations of women and gender in works of art and art historical texts. Pre: 252 or WMS 150 or permission of instructor.

b. ADD: The following new courses:

- 1) **ART 315 Photography II – The Digital Darkroom (3)**
 Introduction to the Digital Darkroom with an emphasis on digital workflow, printing and the use of digital as a form of artistic expression. Required projects and readings. (Studio 6)

May be repeated once for credit with permission of instructor. Pre: 213 and 204 or permission of instructor.

2) **ART 324 Figure Drawing and Painting (3)**

Introduction, exploration and integration of materials, principles and techniques related to the human figure. Emphasis on conceptual and observational approach to structure and development of form. May be repeated once for credit with permission of instructor. Pre: 207 and 208 and 221 or permission of instructor.

B. College of Engineering

Department of Electrical, Computer and Biomedical Engineering

CHANGE: Code for the following courses:

- 1) ELE 207 to "BME 207 Introduction to Biomedical Engineering (3)"
- 2) ELE 282 to "BME 282 Biomedical Engineering Seminar (1)"
- 3) ELE 307 to "BME 307 Bioelectricity (3)"
- 4) ELE 382 to "BME 382 Biomedical Engineering Seminar II (1)"

C. College of Human Science and Services

1. Department of Human Development and Family Studies

- a. CHANGE: Credits for HDF 190 to "3".
- b. ADD: **HDF 291 Rose Butler Brown Peer Mentoring Program (3)**
Explores cultural identity, adult development, leadership, body image, the media, issues relevant to women of color, community engagement and mentoring. Elective for leadership minors (Lec. 3). Pre permission of instructor.

2. Department of Kinesiology

- a. ADD: The following courses:
 - 1) **KIN 116 Teaching Individual Sports Activities (1)**
Emphasis on learning rules of play, sport specific skills, and teaching and instructional methods for sport activities and games that are individually based. (Lab. 3) Pre: Kinesiology majors only.

2) **KIN 117 Teaching Team Sports Activities (1)**
Emphasis on learning rules of play, sport s specific skills, and teaching and instructional methods for sport activities and games that are team based. (Lab. 3)
Pre: Kinesiology majors only.

3) **KIN 118 Teaching Lifetime Physical Activities (1)**
Emphasis on learning rules of play, sport specific skills, and teaching and instructional methods for physical activities and games that are lifetime fitness based. (Lab. 3) Pre: Kinesiology majors only.

b. CHANGE: Credits for KIN 324 to "1," method of instruction to "(Lab. 3)" and prerequisite to: "Pre: Kinesiology majors only."

D. College of Pharmacy

Departments of Pharmacy Practice and Biomedical and
Pharmaceutical Sciences

ADD: The following new courses effective spring 2008:

1) **PHP 305 Drug Information and the Analysis of Literature (3)**

Students will evaluate drug information questions using drug information sources and will explore study design and methodology of drug trials to interpret results in the care patients. (Lec. 3) Pre: first-year Doctor of Pharmacy professional student in good standing or permission of instructor.

2) **PHP 310 (or BPS 310) Foundations of Human Disease: Renal and Cardiovascular Diseases (2)**

The etiology, pathogenesis, epidemiology, and symptomatology, and diagnosis of renal and cardiovascular diseases. (Lec. 2) Pre: first-year Doctor of Pharmacy professional student in good standing or permission of instructor.

3) **PHP 332 Pharmacotherapy of Renal and Cardiovascular Disorders (3)**

The appropriate use of medications in the treatment of human disease. Interpretation of clinical data to design, monitor, and modify drug therapy in renal and cardiovascular disease. (Lec. 3) Pre: Doctor of Pharmacy professional student in good standing or permission of instructor.
