SUBJECT: Curricular Report from the December 7, 2007 meeting of the College of Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee

On December 7, 2007 the Curriculum Committee approved the following matters. If there are no questions or objections by January 4, 2008, they will be forwarded to the Curricular Affairs Committee and/or Graduate Council for approval. Approved proposals are available in the Dean's Office for your perusal during this 10-day period.

- I. The Department of Communication Studies requests a change in prerequisite for COM 381, Research Methods in Communication. (Proposal #29)
- II. The Film Media Program requests the addition of three new courses: FLM 110, Introduction to Film Media Production Technologies, FLM 351, Topics in Film Media Production, and FLM 352, Topics in Film Media Critical Studies. (Proposals #25, #26a, & #26b)
- III. The Graduate School of Library & Information Studies requests a change in title and catalog description for LSC 503, Collection Development, and LSC 548, Information Architecture, and a change in catalog description for LSC 508, Introduction to Information Science & Technology. (Proposals #32, #33, & #34)
- IV. The Department of Journalism requests to cross-list JOR 415, Perspectives on Reporting, with WRT 415. (Proposal #39)
- V. The Department of Languages requests a change in credits for GER 485 and GER 486, Special Studies. (Proposal #41)
- VI. The Department of Psychology requests a change in credits and catalog description for PSY 615, Collaborative Research. (Proposal #31)
- VII. The Department of Sociology & Anthropology requests two new courses, SOC 300, Contemporary Mexican Society, and APG 328, Gender & Culture. (Proposals #36 & #38)
- VIII. The Women's Studies Program requests two new courses, WMS 302, Women and Health, and WMS 430, Human Rights and Foreign Policy. (Proposals #37 & #28)

In addition, the Arts & Sciences Curriculum Committee has approved for BLS credit the following courses:

- I. The Department of Communication Studies requests approval of COM 101, Communication Fundamentals, for General Education credit in English Communication. (Proposal #24)
- II. The Department of Languages requests approval of FRN 391, Literature to 1789 in Translation, FRN 392, 19th Century Literature in Translation, and FRN 393, 20th Century Literature in Translation, for General Education credit in Fine Arts & Literature, Foreign Language/Cross-cultural Competence, and Letters. (Proposals #35a, #35b, & 35c)
