Curricular Affairs Committee

Minutes for the Seventh meeting of the 2007-2008 academic year.

- I. The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, March 24, 2008, in Library Conference Room A, Chairperson Luebke presiding.

The following members were present: Professors Englander, Hickox, Honhart, Luebke, MacDonald, Mahler, Mundorf and Robbins; Ms. Grubman served as the Provosts designee.

Chairperson Luebke noted that Consent Agenda items were labeled with a **C** and that any member could request that an item on the Consent Agenda be discussed.

A motion was made to approve the Consent Agenda. The motion carried.

The committee discussed the proposal from the Course Fee Subcommittee and approved the recommendations.
