REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
March 31, 2006

During the 2005-06 academic year, the Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate reviewed the process for Administrator Evaluation outlined in the UNIVERSITY MANUAL. The committee agreed that the process is drawn-out, cumbersome, and does not coordinate with any administrator review schedule.

The Executive Committee recommends that the process as outlined in the UNIVERSITY MANUAL Sections 5.76.10 - 5.76.12 10.90.10 - 10.90 15 be suspended for one year (2006-07), during which a small ad hoc committee will oversee a pilot evaluation of the next administrator subject to review by the Provost.

This ad hoc committee shall also review the Administrator Evaluation Process as outlined in the UNIVERSITY MANUAL and recommend changes for integrating and streamlining procedures in the Faculty Senate's Administrator Evaluation Process. The goals of a new process are these: 1) to mesh more closely with The Provost's' review of administrators, and 2) to introduce a timely faculty perspective that will be useful to the Provost in her evaluation.
