Students seeking admission to the bachelor's degree program in HDF must complete the following courses with an overall GPA of 2.00 or better prior to acceptance into the HDF Department; PSY 113, HDF 200, or 201, one 100 or 200 level Sociology course, and General Education credits in Math. An overall 2.00 QPA is needed to transfer from University College to the College of Human Science and Services. Once admitted to the ECE Program, students must maintain a 2.50 QPA in HDF/EDC courses and overall.
