STUDENTS EXPECTING TO BRING SPOUSES AND/OR CHILDREN SHOULD PLAN TO HAVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS

SPOUSE: \$3,600 (for each 12 month period)
PER CHILD: \$2,000 (for each 12 month period)

INSURANCE COVERAGE (for each 12 month period)

SPOUSE: \$2,155 (for each 12 month period)
CHILDREN: \$1,624 (for each 12 month period)

(Dependent children rate is not calculated per child. One amount to cover 1 or more children)

MANDATORY HEALTH SERVICE FEE FOR SPOUSE: \$412.

Please Note:

- Graduate Students should anticipate costs of about \$1,500 for "settling-in."
- Undergraduate students in residence halls should plan to bring about \$500 for bedding, rugs, lamps, and so on.
- **Bank drafts** clear in 4-6 weeks. Plan to bring adequate funds in travelers' checks (US dollars). This is extremely important, as no emergency funds are available to help students who run into financial difficulty.
