F. PUBLIC FORUM:

President David Dooley

Boiteau: Motion to wave 10 minutes

Rodrigues 2nd

Dooley: Last time I was here, talked about priorities I had for institution and coming year. Today I thought we could hear from you about what is on your mind

May: How do you view progression of the new dorms going?

Dooley: Very positive not done yet, I've only toured haven't lived yet but the dorms around Roger Williams center is our biggest project. Major challenge, \$70 or \$80 million challenge. I think it would be desirable to expend amount of beds. Growth in Greek system is positive, 2 new buildings being built in fraternity circle. Would be good to increase opportunities for students to live on campus.

Cowen: Under the previous administration, they viewed Greek system as a big part of the problem with partying at the university. What is your view on it and the current fraternities and sororities?

Dooley: I'm a strong fan of vibrant Greek life. I view them as positive and a contributor here.

Charitable work, social events. I'm very impressed with the leadership and the members

Sinapi: Board of governors has a report from investigative committee saying campus police should be armed and an opinion bill from senate. Nothing happened? Anything planning on happening?

Dooley: Supporting move to arm the URI police, undertake seriously, everything would need to be done in a way to prepare our force. For URI it makes sense. Complication for board of governors is URI is maybe a different case than other RI institutions, think that's one thing their thinking about. It's been a while need to make sure senate is still supporting and touch base with important constituencies and groups before making a final decision

Sinapi: None of those things can be done until board of governor's acts. It's been almost 2 years.

Dooley: It has taken a long time, not sure why it has taken the board so long. I know they consider it a big step. We will need a signal from the board that they are prepared. A lot of the conversations, we have dialogue going and have expressed opinion and will come forward for consideration this year as of January we will have a new governor and new members of board of governors for higher ed and will change context a little bit.

Dallinga: Past few years have changed tailgating rules, had positive affect, what are your ideas for the future with that.

Dooley: It adds a lot of vibrancy to weekend and game day experience, has worked smoothly so far, and very positive. Great outcomes is good to see a lot of younger alumni coming back. This year was different from last year, see if we can improve it more, want to continue to promote it. Have had really good attendance at our games, and having that tailgating experience has improved attendance. I think it will continue and we can look at ways to improve it.

Cologna: Concerns of students graduating on time in 4 years, I think big problem is advising system what is your opinion on it

Dooley: What efficiencies do you see in current advisement and what do you need. I've only talked to a few dozen students about advising, I've gotten UC works well, but it's the transition to advising in your major. Quality and accessibility of advisement can be compromised. I think advising is part of the problem with graduation rates, another issue is increasing number of students who have to hold some kind of job, so the credits they take per semester gets cut back. I'm a believer if we can improve advising we can have positive impact on students. Build robust web based advising component. Software that can accumulate questions and answers. Apps for smart phones and computers. Look at it to provide more hands on stuff for when advisor may not be available.

Caisse: Ceremony for pharmacy building, increased funding to URI from out of state. But did you talk about getting more funds from in state. There should be more money coming from out of state than in state.

Dooley: Gave a talk about this last week, I think over last 4 years reduction of state support for operations budget have had dramatic impacts on students. Most happened before I got here. Continued to provide high quality education. URI has done as good as could have. Can't go further down the road without more serious consequences. Don't want to price RI students out either. Hoping state will put additional money into higher ed this upcoming year, that's something were asking for. Know they believe it is important and a priority but it is difficult. Have to protect quality at the same time.

Cowen: Different aspects of Greek system and that's its not all partying, but it is a major part of it. How can we have a strong Greek system while increasing crackdowns? Shouldn't they worry more about arming police, and parking that things like that?

Dooley: I would like to hear more about what you think the issues are. It has been a positive addition to campus life, and its traditional to have a social life, but doesn't need to be the animal house kind of thing. Would like to hear more about that, and what Greek staff think about it and what you might have in mind. I have seen a lot of things work but it's what would work here. Under what circumstances will we try something and see if it works, like tailgating. Not opposed to looking at other things like that. See what other campuses do and if it looks like it could be a fit, try it

May: When I went to high school my school found it possible to bring technological advances into classes like the smart board, are you open to using things like that and expanding international experiential learning

Dooley: Absolutely, will be sitting down and talking about what kind of investments do we need to make to enrich learning environment. Improve gatekeeper classes into gateway classes using the right technologies. Need to get more technology into existing classrooms and get academic to make use of it. Don't want students to be constrained to a 14 week course. Breaking down courses students find difficult. Break it into 4 modules. If you do bad in one piece you only have to redo one piece of it.

Holden: Significant increase of URI moving to 4 credits. Some colleges are struggling to incorporate into curriculum, what is your take on this?

Dooley: It may work well in part but not others. I think having a mix should be possible. I'm for having fewer courses. Amherst college 4 courses a semester and students are well prepared with 99% 4 year graduation rate. It's not number of courses you take its how well the curriculum is.

Berger: Many trees being cut down, environment should be preserved, what is your thought on new chemistry building, do you think old one could have been renovated?

Dooley: no it would have cost more because it is so so old. Can't teach while the renovations are happening so for 2 years need to find classrooms or laboratories for thousands of students. Current strategy is to leave Pastore in place and build new building. Doesn't mean we're increasing carbon footprint. Were building a much greener building. And were not committed to keeping Pastore, it could be green space. Already talked about it in the campus group, if somebody gives us tons of money to build some sort of building we would look at that. Those are decisions for the future. We know we can build a much more energy efficient building.

Rodrigues: Plan set with Ryan center for alcoholic purposes for 21+?

Dooley: Other people have suggested and we've looked into it. Not something we're looking at because most universities don't have good experience with it.

Sinapi: Motion for 2 questions and right to speak after. Or advising, I've had problems on every level. As UC goes, advising is terrible, had to report my advisor, she gave me wrong info that resulted in problems later. They aren't trained and then college advisers are worse. They are not fit to advise anything but their own classroom. Course catalog and handbook is unclear and conflicting. Best advisor I know on this campus is me and that's not good. Advisors here steer people wrong or not at all and are useless. UC is not good. The ways we have need to be audited and fixed

Dooley: Send me a page or 2 that outlines what you shared. Ac affairs committee putting advisement on table and seeing how to improve it.

Sinapi: Ryan center has furthered debt, same with bookstore and that money needs to come from somewhere. Capital funding is going to good places but while that's happening I've watched my majors slip. Political science doesn't have enough courses to really educate. Sociology has excellent professors but students have a hard time maneuvering because classes are full and their understaffed, but all money goes elsewhere. Some majors are getting neglected, but everybody is paying for that.

Dooley: When Ryan center was built, there was a part where students pay a fee that goes towards that, which you all pay. Auxiliary operations are independent of state budget. We have fewer faculty and staff than 5 years ago so were spending less in some areas and you're seeing consequences. Tuition has gone up a lot essentially it has just been increased enough to offset state funding.

Cowen: Why does hockey team pay for ice time at own arena?

Member: That's what they require us to pay, I believe other teams don't pay at all for ice time.

Coates: Part of much larger issue, encourage you all to vote in favor

Bruce: Excellent history, if see what they did in past few months

K Stewart: I've seen hockey team out soliciting now charging admission

Segal: Where are you getting the money from to pay back the loans?

Member: Annual fundraiser soliciting, gold tournaments, charging admission for students, major budget cuts, not doing anymore. Women's team cut tournament in Missouri, which will help eventually

Boiteau: It says on back of sheet they're paying amounts each year. They increased dues.

Sharkey: How long do you plan on staying with them, or what is the program to ensure this doesn't happen in future?

Member: I'm graduating in spring, but the new club sports director, we picked the absolute best candidate, he is making sure policies and rules are being followed. Updated bylaws this summer so teams follow the rules.

Acevedo: Why is past director not being held responsible?

Member: At the time we didn't know there was an issue, when he left we had gotten reports but found that bills weren't paid. No loss of money just mismanagement of not paying bills.

Curry: Do you plan on having a system to make sure new director is in line?

Member: Exec board has done a lot of work, focused on checks and balances so we won't be in position again. Asking for loan so team won't have to completely suffer by this.
