**Clarke-** Time?

**Member-** 6:00.

**Prata-** I encourage you to vote for this, they've done it a few years it's a great success, for those of you on cultural who have to go to an event keep your ears open.

**Petit-** This is the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> year they've done this week for aids awareness, I know every year they've had a comedian it's been a full house, free to everyone.

**Rodrigues-** I hate to ask but what is the date and time?

**Member-** Nov 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:00.

**Messineo-** Is immediate consideration based on proximity of event?

**Petit-** The reason is because they are trying to get the comedian booked and if we wait until next week they may not get them.

Vote- passed

**Petit-** Only a handful of people showed up for my finance 101 meeting so I'll be doing the presentation again so that you all know, that way if students come into the office you can help them.

**Rodrigues-** I'd like to grant time to member.

**Member-** You have to give paperwork to Lorrie because she doesn't acknowledge our budget.

**Slater-** Motion to reconsider bill SS-09/10-24, motion denied.

**Petit-** See finance slides online.

**Clarke-** Do groups need to work with SPO to do contracts?

**Petit-** You should see Bruce, Maureen, or Michael Knolf. Make sure you meet Bruce. He's a cool guy.

**Clarke-** How far in advance do you need to fill out a purchase request?

**Petit-** 5 business days ahead just to be safe, usually only takes 2 or 3 days, but if Lorrie is busy it may not get done.

**Messineo-** We have these great things in the union called screens and you can request one.

**Petit-** We did request it and didn't get one.

**Petit-** The last thing I want to say is to the new people if you're ever confused about anything, don't be afraid to ask questions to older senators.

**Slater-** Motion to reconsider bill SS-09/10-24, Coates seconded.

**Shah-** I'm going to deny because apparently division was called, I did not hear that so I am going to say it passes. Because there's no record of AYE or NAY, you have to be on the prevailing side to reconsider a bill. You can overturn and debate on whether that motion is correct.

**Coates-** I think the vote was much closer than most people realize.

**Bruce-** Are you making a motion to overrule the chair?

**Coates-** Motion to overrule chair, Slater seconds.

**Bruce-** If there's a motion then you can discuss.

**Coates-** I think the vote was closer than you realize and I know Slater was one of the people to vote in favor of bill (4-0-1). Under motion to reconsider its also motion to go back and reconsider a hasty motion and I do believe division was called.

**Boiteau-** I know Dave mentioned that Slater voted for bill in committee, but that's just to get it to senate floor, not necessarily that he voted for bill.

**Clarke-** I think all the nays were louder and concentrated. Think its unnecessary to reconsider.

**Bruce-** If you have an issue in terms of whether it was premature, you should look at whether the discussion was cut short. You can't reconsider when there was no roll call. It's not relevant if you didn't take a record of the bill. If you want to debate whether it was premature you can continue that.

**Coates-** If that's the precedent that's going to be set were probably going to have to take roll call the rest of the year.

**Sinapi-** If division was called because we went so quickly, that alone should call for reevaluating. It's only going to take a few minutes to do roll call. To have to do roll call every time, I'd rather not do that.

**Holzman-** Move to previous question, Holden seconds.

**Shah-** You're voting on whether you want to overrule my decision to not hear their decision. Aye to overrule chair.

**Clarke-** Are we going to revote or re-discuss bill?

**Shah-** We're talking about my denial of their motion, so you're voting on my denial of their motion. You're voting on whether you want to go back to vote.

**Petit-** So, if you want to go back to the bill and reconsider it, talk about it and revote again, you're going to vote aye, if you don't not want to you're going to vote nay.

Vote- division, 14 ayes, 13 nays

**Bruce-** It's a majority vote to overrule the chair.

**Shah-** I was overruled, motion passes.

**Bruce-** I'd like to point out that CJ from union board has left the building.

**Petit-** I'm wondering if anyone had anymore questions for me, so if anyone had questions I'll answer.

**Messineo-** Is there any way, because it's kind of unfair to do this without the member, to postpone bill?

**Petit-** Bruce can correct me, but I think there's a few ways we could do that. Someone could motion to table bill to next week, vote that happened before does not count, and we'll do it next week and vote again, you could vote down this bill, union board would come to finance again and request money.

**Clarke-** I would make a motion to take a roll call on previous vote.

**Shah-** We cannot do that.

**Holzman-** Point of order, Coates was not seconded.

**Shah-** He was.

**Petit-** So we're back on the bill now, like I was saying we could fail this bill and they could come back, we could table bill and have someone come back, we could vote in favor of this bill. Anyone have any questions about bill?

**Faustin-** Motion to table bill, seconded by Sinapi.

Bill is tabled

**Messineo-** Make sure the rep knows he needs to come to the meeting next week.

**Boiteau-** An overall comment, the finance committee recommended 4-0-1 to say yes to bill, and I know a lot of the students count on that bus, I think it was a bad idea to table this and possibly vote it down next week.

**Sinapi-** It wouldn't be the first time.

**Petit-** The abstention on that bill was me, I wasn't sure how I felt on it. I saw the haziness for giving them money to give it to ram tours but not really, I wanted full senate to decide. Talk about it next week.

**Bruce-** You may not know that ram tours goes through union board. My administrative assistant coordinates the program.

**Bedard-** General comment, this all could have been avoided so if you plan on calling division in the future make sure you speak up. Be confident in your decision. Bring it on.

To figure this out and let us know. I want to get that going as soon as possible.

**Holzman-** On that topic I've already started drafting a charter for the affiliate org that would do that for us. It seems to be the best way, they would have their own exec, take their cues from senate, lobby. If you're interested in helping write charter or helping me research how other school are doing it, apparently all the university of California campuses do this.

**Prata-** Point of information, is this something that can fall under external?

**Sinapi-** Yes, but the work load that this committee will have to do will be vast and Amanda already has a lot to do, and lobbying is lot of work.

**Bedard-** Ok, basically the way I would like the handled, an idea such as lobbyist affiliate would fall under external affairs. Putting together an affiliate takes it own committee but because of the way our bylaws are written we can't make a committee that is doing something another committee is already doing. This is similar to Rammies last year so how we did that was we had a sub-committee of cultural that focused just on Rammies and reported out through cultural. Max reported to exec. Basically my plan for this lobbyist affiliate is to have a sub-committee headed by Jacob, that will report to external and Amanda will report to exec committee. It's not an official committee so I'm not going to appoint people to it. If it's something you're interested in talk to Jacob hell find a time you can meet. In another week of two they'll start going to Amanda and reporting.

**Petit-** When is externals meeting time?

**Clarke-** We haven't figured that out yet because we just moved exec.

**Petit-** When you had your meeting last week did the discussion of the lobbyist come up?

**Clarke-** No, because I talked to Jacob the next day after the meeting so I haven't even had a chance to talk about it.

**Clarke-** As external I feel this is a good opportunity, if they're willing to put in the work I think it's worth it, I have a list of lobbying laws, Jacob I'd like to go over them with you. I think there needs to be a voice from the students.
