Petit- Had finance 101 meeting on Monday, pretty good turnout, if someone didn't attend I have copies of the book behind my desk. People who didn't sign signature cards can't sign up for events and they have lost any that they scheduled. Tell them to come by my office hours. Also I want to thank those of you who showed up for the finance 101 meeting. But don't worry I'll be doing the presentation next week for you guys.

- STUDENT ORGANIZATION ADVISORY AND REVIEW COMMITTEE (SOARC):

Holland- Re-rec was due today, didn't count but it looks like we had a very good turnout. President's meeting on Monday went well, that's really it for now we'll be working on re-rec for a couple of weeks now.

- ACADEMIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE: Coates- Hi, the provost student advisory council met yesterday and I didn't personally attend but Holzman went, he can tell you a little about it.

Holzman- The provost went over three things. First, I'm pretty sure you all got an email about the undergraduate research opportunity, faculty advisor put together project where you can ask for a grant between 800-1200 dollars alone or in a group of up to three. We also talked about IDEAs as replacement for SETs. We talked about how to raise response rates. For spring it wasn't mandatory and it was only about 50% rate. We talked about withholding grades or something of that nature, putting it on university letterhead instead of a 3rd party company. Studies of transferences we've done, going from set to ideas, show that online responses are slightly more positive than traditional paper forms. Because response rate was so low they're going back to a paper set, but retaining the same questions and putting it back in classroom. Provost does not want to continue with paper and this will go digital in time. Finally, for those of you who participated in spring there was a faculty summit on academic future of university, provost did same for students, result was academic vision. That has been developed into academic plan until 2015. Reviewing that, taking a vision and turning it into how we're going to do it. Goals, strategies and actions. Its online you can get a copy. Going over how to specifically facilitate these actions.

Prata- If they do choose to go back to paper version is there going to be a penalty if students aren't in class?

Holzman- That was something that was brought up. If it's on paper, no. It's a large (98%) response rate in class if only one person is missing. Making it an extra credit assignment if it was online was something that was brought on, to minimize transparency. If the teacher knows they filled it out they could also find out the answers.

Coates- The decision to go from digital to paper was made by the teachers union.

Petit- I wanted to say that the decision to go back to paper was because the union felt, they said in a newsletter, they felt it wasn't a high enough response rate. However when Dave and I met with one of the members of the team, the response rate was what was expected. There was a lot of confusion because so many teachers didn't even mention it to students. For other schools the response rate was same as ours for first semester and then it increased. Pulling it was not a good step because it will get better and it will cost more money to keep it on paper.

Holzman- The reason they pulled it so quickly is because those results are being used in their tenure and seniority hearings so they were concerned if it was a low response rate only students who did not like them would respond.

Slater- First thing they said people who liked the class bothered to fill it out, so I don't know why they would complain if 50% of the results are positive. Maybe holding an account to make people fill it out. So unless they make it mandatory there's no way people will fill it out.

Holland- Would we be able to keep it online but motivate students to submit by having a page after that says thank you for submitting so they can print it out and hand it in for extra credit but still be anonymous?

Coates- That's a good idea. If they want participation they need more incentive. They should add more questions that will be relevant to students like "were the textbooks useful?" especially with cost of books recently. Questions like "how was the class taught?" Things like that that will be helpful. Suggested publishing certain results.

Holland- I also agree on changing some questions because when I filled out online one, they did not necessarily ask questions that allowed you to say you had a bad professor. They were phrased wrong. I'll be glad to come with you if you need to talk to someone about it.

Petit- To talk about what Katherine was saying, when we met with them we brought all of those concerns forward. To talk about idea of people having ideas held up, it was presented last year and I opposed that because I thought it might prevent some people from graduating. Although I feel that everyone should fill it out I don't think you should be forced to.

Slater- Extra credit was proposed and some teachers did, so eventually it will come to the same pace as the paper one. One issue was also having to do 5 surveys over and over. Maybe spacing it out. People would take more time.

Coates- General incentive is that as a student you should care about the quality of teacher. The IDEAs actually get looked at for tenure so if you had a bad teacher you should fill it out, if you think they were good and should get promoted you should fill it out too.

Renzi- I think part of the problem with the email system, being reminded every 3 days made me a little crazy, didn't want to fill out maybe out of spite.

Coates- I have no control over that that's the company.

Petit- We actually talked about that, they did that on purpose because it was a new system. They were fearful that if you saw it once you would delete it but if you saw it more than once you would do it.

Slater- Another issue was that a lot of people don't use webmail so people that could have gotten link may have not gotten it in time.

Petit- One point I brought up was that student don't use webmail and talked about how we could make it easier to forward mail from webmail but university couldn't send it unless it was to that URI email.

Sinapi- They have an interesting situation at Amherst. Their version of webct, you can go on and your class is on there. You can't access your class until you do the evaluation. Can get around that problem by having it set up for sakai or any system that requires your id.

Prata- I was going to say something similar, instead of withholding grades, if you put some kind of a hold so that you can't register for classes so it won't affect seniors.

Holzman- Permission to respond. Yes. In response to hold problem, by end of semester most people have registered for classes. Making it mandatory, requirement vs. incentive to complete.

There was discussion about putting it on e-campus to make it look more official or direct. Doing it on sakai is an option. Blackboard blocks mail. Webct was blocked by blackboard because product was discontinued. Reason we moved to sakai.

- **EXTERNAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE: Clarke-** Hi, tomorrow night is the coalition meeting I will be moderating, special guest former senator O'Brien. I hope you can all attend, especially those of you who live off campus. If we show that we do care and want to improve communications that's the way to do it. Starting next week I'm going ahead with recycling project. Working with town, local residents, seeing if we can get town to fund it. I also want to do some smaller projects while this is going on. Any suggestions let me know now or put it in my box. I moved my committee time to Mondays at 5:15.

MacKinnon- What time is meeting tomorrow?

Clarke- 6:30-8 in the ballroom.

- **CULTURAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE: Prata-** We had another meeting and we set date for cultural fair for November 30th in ballroom. Went to first president's meeting ever. After people signed up for attendance I sent around a flyer for people who wanted to participate, only 8 groups signed up. Hopefully, we're going to make more of an effort to ask them. I hope more than 8 groups are interested. If any of you are involved in groups that want to attend please let me know it's in ballroom. Were also working on a clothing drive with orgs. Were doing this instead of a food drive because greek system does that. Were not 100% sure if it's going to be a competition. So if you have any ideas for a prize let me know. I'd like to talk to Officer Marc after meeting. Drop off points for clothing drive, I need to talk to Bruce because I don't know where we are allowed to do this.

Holland- Send me an email saying what you want to say and I'll forward it so they can talk to you if they have ideas about holiday fair.

- **CAMPUS AFFAIRS COMMITTEE: Sinapi-** Everything's pending. Though I am looking for ideas on how to solve problem on plains road lot where people are trying to get to classes from 9-noon. It's packed. Let me know if you have any ideas.

Slater- Another hillclimber so we don't have a million people trying to fit into a tiny bus.

Sinapi- Hillclimber comes here during set hours. Hillclimber is not going when it's supposed to be. If you see it just chilling let me know when. I already know they're doing it. It's supposed to be running constantly. If it was I think it would solve the problem. Getting a new shuttle next fall.

Please save your can tabs, if you're like Steve. Voting begins next week. Vote for Vidhi she is representing student senate not just herself. T-shirt sales begin tomorrow. SAA will be storing t-shirts in our office so just put up with it for a week. One last note, Kim will be off on Monday I gave her the day off so she can go up to New Hampshire for the weekend. If you need anything get it to her before Friday. You will be here on Monday because classes are in session. Go to the wheelhouse tonight.

Prata- Where do we put can tabs?

L. GENERAL DISCUSSION AND OPEN FORUM: **Rodrigues-** Motion to adjourn, denied.

Petit- Take a minute to talk about stricken bill. Idea is there's a few other universities that their student governments have students that go to their state houses and lobby on behalf of their university. So what we are hoping to do is create our own lobbying core, which would be an affiliate, and it would be a group of students, they don't have to be on senate, work under an advisor and they would go down to state house and lobby. They would know what positions based on what we senate pass. They would lobby our opinion.

Coates- my committee before everyone leaves come see me.

Clarke- I agree with this, I think we should go and I would like to be the lobbyist. I don't have time in my schedule to be lobbyist so I like idea of group. I think we should have a liaison to state house or if some members are interested in joining external and pushing forward.

Holzman- I feel pretty strongly about this so I'll kick it off one way or another. I hope I inspired a couple people to read bylaws, talk about it. Part of reason lost support, bill was written in contradiction of bylaws. I was aware of that, that said I wanted to discuss Amanda's point about having an affiliate vs. a liaison. A liaison reports back more than interacts, I'd be interested in hearing what people have for ideas.

Bedard- Let me clear up the confusion. Those of you who were at exec last night know that I was against putting a bill to create this lobbying group. However I am in support of this affiliate, I want to create a group and have them report out through external. Reason I was against bill was that there was a direct violation of our bylaws, and it's not necessary because we have external affairs. In our bylaws there is a section that states about additional special committees. Quotes bylaws. A committee on lobbying while it would be advantageous, a committee cannot interfere with any other committee. External does what this group would do, which is why I want to push affiliate idea forward but not through legislation for a special committee. I want these people to work together, meet with Amanda, figure out how they're going to go about this. That was my rationale for talking down a bill to create a special committee. If you disagree I would be more than happy to talk to you later. At least you should look at bill and look at ideas. Talk to people who wrote bill, talk to Amanda, get ball rolling,

Sinapi- As far as having a liaison, they're pretty much useless. Means of communications. Affiliate is a subgroup representing our interest. Bear in mind, this committee is meant to figure out how to go about doing this and then to start it up. Figure out if it's feasible, how and to get it going.
