L. GENERAL DISCUSSION AND OPEN FORUM:

Prata- I forgot to mention, date of rammies. April 26th in ballroom from 630-930. 630-730 cocktail hour, 730-930 awards.

Boiteau- This is something I've been thinking about, I wanted to hear if anyone had any opinions on URI cutting its football team. Northeastern has and so has Hofstra.

Cologna- I would be in favor considering the average turnout is 67 people we went 1 and 10 and lost both to northeastern and hofstra.

Holzman- Yea I'm in favor of this as well, besides their poor record were not a school that follows its football team, not cutting any school spirit. My only concern is because those 67 people do bring in some amount of revenue. I'm wondering if that affects operational budget. They still have stadium which will be sitting there unused, I don't know if it can be used.

Rodrigues- Also in favor. They said in projo they're having a rebuilding year, been saying that for 20 years now. Bad that we have a team under 500, I think it would save money because of amount of scholarships players receive, full ride. So I'm in favor of cutting.

Elliott- I have mixed feelings just because I would like to wait a couple of years to see how new tailgating policy is. My understanding is it's brought a lot more alumni to the games.

MacKinnon- Every single fiber in my being wants us to keep team but for economic reasons it can go because no one is going to watch a 1 and 10 team year after year. In the three years I've been here we've had three different coaches, that's not going to make a winning team. It most likely needs to be done.

Bedard- What you guys probably don't realize, football generates more money than any other sport besides basketball. Other schools pay for us to go get shalacked by their football teams. No one is happy about amount of wins. The football team will turn around eventually. I thought Rizzi was the way out, but he went to the NFL and who can blame him. New coach has full support of athletics. Yea if we keep losing no one is going to come, keep in mind they are turning around in the black not the red. Second to only men's basketball. What I would say, most of your concerns circle around their 1 and 10 record, maximum of 6 wins in four years. Don't let that be the reason you want to cut a team. Might be others like that but you don't suggest because we don't hear about them. Instead of talking about it, go to the games. They are your team. Generating funds for smaller teams that don't get media coverage. Support them, I have faith that coach Trainor will turn it around.

Bruce- Before you go much further, put it in committee that's appropriate, talk to Thor. Things that you don't realize about division 1.

Sinapi- I'm curious to know how much revenue they bring in. Someone mentioned the price tag would give us a couple million. I agree about the scholarships like Jorge. We're cheap. It shouldn't be about revenue should be about students.

Bruce- For example, if you ended football today you still would honor scholarships of students that are here until they leave. You don't have all the information.

Petit- I really think this is an inappropriate topic for us to be discussing. I would hope that if anyone is left you would not say anything.

Slater- Not for necessarily dropping, I'm just saying there are a bunch of teams sitting on the sideline that would like the money.

Tondreau- Since you mentioned facts, I work for athletics. Cutting the football team would be a liability. There are a lot of scholarships we need to honor. Over time bring in revenue but it will take time.

Bruce- If you know anyone nominated for Rainville awards, deadline is fast approaching.

Holden- Yield time to people in the back.

Holden (freshmen)- I will be running for rep at large, I would appreciate your support you seem like a swell group of people.

Petit- What I would ask senate to do, we've been debating things. I think appropriate thing to do is if we want to make an opinion is to write a bill. You get together, in a committee, they don't want to take it up. Get 5 senators together. Refer it to appropriate committee. I think headline of cigar is tomorrow is senate thinks we should cut football team and we shouldn't be discussing it. If you have something you care about go about it another way.

Clarke- Some of you mentioned running for different positions, I want to say external is up for grabs. I want to encourage you all to run I love this position, I've put a lot of effort into improving relations. I hope if you run you really want to do it.

Holland- Meet in back. Pink out shirts sold starting tomorrow.

Bedard- For the cigar, senate does not have an opinion, other thing I'm going to slightly disagree with Allen. You don't need a bill for everything. What you should do is go to a committee, cultural should talk about it. Based on your feedback should they decide to they can write a bill. I appreciate discussions and I think we should have more of them.

Elliott- On a lighter note I urge you all to go out to basketball games. As Bickham has said in the past we have a ball giving the other team our two cents.

Caisse- I believe Holzman brought up research park article. I thank him for mentioning it. Great article, Dr. Dooley had a lot of opinions. Any more information?

Holzman- If you didn't read it but are interested its sitting on my desk. Back when Dr. Carothers was here, they commissioned a company to come in and write a report evaluating whether it made economic sense to establish a research park. Is it going to help university? Bearing in mind that that happened while economy was in good shape. Dooley is looking at this, saying economic times have changed and we need to completely reconsider if we're going to put in a park in the near future. Not a question of where but should we even do it right now. 5-10 years or should we wait?

Sinapi- As far as not talking about things, reason were here is to represent students. If you have an opinion state it, you shouldn't be afraid to do so or scolded.
